



## Grand-tek Technology Conflict Minerals Declaration

Grand-tek Technology is dedicated to responsible procurement, requiring suppliers to provide conflict-free raw materials and parts to ensure products do not support armed groups violating human rights.

Support and comply with the OECD's "Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas". Avoid procuring or using tantalum (Ta), tin (Sn), tungsten (W), and gold (Au) from conflict affected areas. Take practical actions to conduct responsible mineral investigations, and do not support or use minerals sourced from armed conflicts, illegal mining, or poor working environments.

Grand-tek Technology assesses the risks of raw material sources based on the OECD Due Diligence Guidance and conducts supply chain due diligence. If the materials contain minerals such as tantalum (Ta), tin (Sn), tungsten (W), and gold (Au), suppliers must cooperate in submitting the latest Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (CMRT) [Note 1] for investigation. This is to ensure that the sources of tantalum (Ta), tin (Sn), tungsten (W), and gold (Au) contained in the products comply with the definition of minerals from conflict-affected and high-risk areas as defined by recognized organizations such as the OECD. Suppliers are also required to communicate this policy to their upstream supply chain and comply with it collectively.
